THEY HAVE DARED CHANGE THE GOSPEL

Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth <u>on me</u> hath everlasting life (John 6:47, 1611 King James Bible).

Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life (John 6:47, 1881 Revised Standard Version).

Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth hath eternal life (John 6:47, 1901 American Standard Version).

"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life (John 6:47, 1960 New American Standard Version).

I tell you the truth, he who believes has everlasting life (John 6:47, 1978 New International Version).

Believes what – that the moon is made of cheese or that there are purple people eaters on Mars? This reveals the last four translations are not really Bibles, for the Bible has no errors. They lay exposed as mere "versions" and nothing more. However, the King James Bible is shown to be the verbal (word for word), plenary (complete: nothing is to be added or subtracted) and infallible, inerrant Word of the Living God.

Indeed:

The AD 1380 Wycliffe translation reads: "in me" The AD 1534 Tyndale translation reads: "on me" The AD 1539 Great Bible (Cranmer's) reads: "in me" The AD 1557 Geneva Bible reads: "on me"
